The following are the key risks applicable to the Issuer: Market risks, business and general macro-economic conditions and fluctuations as well as volatility in the global financial markets could adversely affect the Issuer's business in many ways. The Issuer is subject to risks arising from general macroeconomic conditions in the countries in which it operates, including in particular the UK, Europe, Asia and Australia, as well as global economic conditions. The Issuer is subject to risks concerning customer and counterparty credit quality. Credit and counterparty risk is defined as the risk arising from an obligor's (typically a client's or counterparty's) failure to meet the terms of any agreement. Credit and counterparty risk arises when funds are extended, committed, invested, or otherwise exposed through contractual agreements, whether reflected on- or off-balance sheet. Capital at Risk: Phoenix Kick Out Notes with Capital at Risk are not capital protected.
