



Since then it has undergone changes of name, eventually re-registering under the Companies Act 1985 on 23 January 2009 as a public limited company and is now incorporated under the name Investec Bank plc.</p>

		The Issuer is subject to primary and secondary legislation relating to financial services and banking regulation in the United Kingdom, including, <i>inter alia</i> , the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000, for the purposes of which the Issuer is an authorised person carrying on the business of financial services provision. B.4b	Trends:	<p>The Issuer, in its audited consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2015, reported a decrease of 6.6% in operating profit before goodwill and acquired intangibles and after non-controlling interests to £101.2 million (2014: £108.4 million). The balance sheet remains strong, supported by sound capital and liquidity ratios. At 31 March 2015, the Issuer had £5 billion of cash and near cash to support its activities, representing approximately 43.1% of its liability base. Customer deposits have increased by 10.6% since 31 March 2014 to £10.6 billion at 31 March 2015. The Issuer's loan to deposit ratio was 66.5% as at 31 March 2015 (2014: 69.9%). At 31 March 2015, the Issuer's total capital adequacy ratio was 17.5%. The Issuer's leverage ratio is 7.5%. These disclosures incorporate the deduction of foreseeable dividends as required by the Capital Requirements Regulation and European Banking Authority technical standards. The credit loss charge as a percentage of average gross core loans and advances has increased from 1.00% at 31 March 2014 to 1.16%. The Issuer's gearing ratio remains low with total assets to equity decreasing to 10 times at 31 March 2015.*</p> <p><i>* All financial information in respect of the year ended 31 March 2015 has been prepared following the adoption of IFRIC 21 on 1 April 2014.
